### \$ ./Install\ macOS\ Sierra.app/Contents/Resources/startosinstall --usage

Usage: startosinstall --applicationpath <install macOS.app path>

#### Arguments

- --applicationpath, a path to copy of the OS installer application to start the install with.
- --license, prints the user license agreement only.
- --agreetolicense, agree to license the license you printed with --license.
- --rebootdelay, how long to delay the reboot at the end of preparing. This delay is in seconds and has a maximum of 300 (5 minutes).
- --pidtosignal, Specify a PID to which to send SIGUSR1 upon completion of the prepare phase. To bypass "rebootdelay" send SIGUSR1 back to startosinstall.
- --usage, prints this message.

### Pros

- One approach for both Intel and Apple silicon Macs
- No new things for admins to learn and test
- 'startosinstall' command is run as root: no problem if GUI user is not an admin

### Cons

- Difficult to ensure credentials are handled with complete security
- Future Apple support for startosinstall unclear
- Requires user interaction to start an upgrade

# Approach 2: Just launch the Install macOS app

### Pros


- Uses the method most tested by Apple and end users
- No need to handle user credentials at all
- Insulates us from changes in the startosinstall tool

### Cons

- Users who don't have admin rights can't initiate an install via the Install macOS application
- Requires user interaction to start an upgrade
- Users can just quit the Install macOS application once it is launched
- No way to do the upgrade at the login window or any time a user isn't present

#### Ventura vs. Admins: Summary

- New "Login Items"
  - Users might disable Munki and other launchd items
  - Can be controlled via profile
- App Management
  - Might prevent Munki from updating apps in some cases
  - Should be addressable if it turns out to be an issue
- Upgrade Deferral/Blocking
  - No 100% perfect solution here


